Rudnick** (born December 29, 1957) is an American playwright, writer, screenwriter and essayist. His plays were produced both on Broadway and for his part, and around the world, and Ben Brantley, reviewing *The Most Fabulous Story* Rudnick ever told *The New York Times*, wrote that Line by Line, Mr. Rudnick may be the funniest writer on stage in the United States today. Rudnick's early life was born and raised in a Jewish family in Piscataway, New Jersey, where his mother Selma was a publicist and his father Norman was a physicist. Rudnik attended Yale College before moving to New York, where he wrote a copy of the book jacket and worked as an assistant to his friend, costume designer William Ivey Long. Rud began writing for magazines including *Esquire*, *Vogue*, *Vanity Fair* and *Spy*. The plays and novels of Rudnick's first play was *Poor Little Lambs*, a comedy about a Yale student trying to join Whiffenpoofs, an all-male singing group. The cast of the play included young Kevin Bacon, Bronson Pinchot and Blanche Baker. Rudnick then wrote two novels: *Social Illness*, a satirical tale about New York's nightlife in the spirit of Evelyn Waugh's *Despicable Bodies*, and *I'll Take This*, which was a tribute to Rudnick's mother and aunts and their passionate love of shopping. *The Chicago Tribune* called the book absolutely hysterical, and *The Boston Globe* called it *Flat Out* hilarious. Kind of what I think. G. Wodehouse would have written after spending some time in Bloomingdale's. In the late 1980s, Rudnick moved to the top floor of Greenwich Village, which was once the home of 1920s actor John Barrymore. It inspired Rudnick to play *I Hate Hamlet*, about a young TV star who, as he is about to play Hamlet, was visited by Barrymore's ghost. The play was produced on Broadway and became infamous when Nicole Williamson, the actor who plays Barrymore, began attacking his co-star in a too realistic manner during a duel scene. In 1993, Rudnick made a breakthrough with his off-Broadway hit, *Jeffrey*. At first, no theatre will produce a play because it has been described as an AIDS comedy. But after a famous, sold-out run at the tiny WPA Theater in New York, the show is broadcast for commercial launch. The performance took place from December 31, 1992 to February 14, 1993 at the WPA Theatre. The play was moved to the Off-Broadway Minetta Lane Theatre, which was moved from March 6, 1993 to January 16, 1994. Frank Rich, in *The New York Times*, called Rudnick a showbiz-born show business with the perfect field for priceless one-liners. Stephen Holden, also in the *Times*, said that Jeffrey was just the kind of game Oscar Wilde might have written if he lived in 1990s Manhattan. The mine won the Obi Award, the Circle of External Critics Award and the John Gassner Drama Award The original cast featured John Michael Higgins as Jeffrey, Edward Hibbert, Brian Butt and Harriet Harris and directed by Christopher Ashley. Rudnick's later plays included *Naked Eye*, which depicts an extreme photographer like Robert Mapplethorpe, and in 1998, *The Most Fabulous Story Ever Told*, which was inspired by a fundamentalist remark: God made Adam and Eve, not Adam and Steve. In Rudnik's revisionist view of the Bible, God makes Adam and Steve along with the first lesbians, Jane and Mabel. While the play was protested by religious groups, it moved for a commercial run and the *New York Daily News* said: You'll find yourself laughing uncontrollably during the evening. The mine also wrote *Valhalla*, an epic that intertwined the life of a World War II soldier from Texas with Ludwig, the Mad King of Bavaria; *Regrets Only*, a living room comedy starring Christine Baranski and George Grizzard; and *The New Century*, a compilation of related one-act acts that was produced at Lincoln Center and for which actress Linda Lavigne won the Drama Desk Award. Mine recently promoted a two-part, gay agenda and my husband's off-Broadway anthology *Standing at the Ceremony: Gay Marriage Plays*. My husband was released, playing on the air as a radio play on a podcast and public radio featuring Michael Urie and Harriet Harris, directed by Claudia Weil. In September 2017, the play *RedMan's Big Night* opened at the Kirk Douglas Theater in Los Angeles, where it played until Oct. Wendy Malik starred in this tragicomedy at the Academy Awards, described by *The Hollywood Reporter* as often a funny but mostly tangled ensemble piece. Rudnick's new play *Guilty Pleasure* was due to be released at laJolla Playhouse in the fall of 2020, but due to the pandemic, the premiere will take place next fall, directed by Christopher Ashley. The screenwriter worked as an unregistered screenwriter on such films as *The Addams Family* and *The First Wives Club*. He was credited as the pseudonym Joseph Howard for his work on the *Sister Act*, which was originally intended as a vehicle for Bette Midler; The script had gone through many changes, and by the time it became re-fashionable for Whoopi Goldberg he had refused to have his real name associated with it. He received the only written credit for *Addams Family Values*, in and on-screen version of his play *Jeffrey*. The mine's later scripted forays included *Not She's Great* and a remake of *Stepford Wives*. His screenplay for *Coastal Elite* -- a socially-removed film about the COVID-19 pandemic - was directed by Jay Roach and stars Bette Midler, Dan Levy, Issa Rae, Sarah Paulson, and Caitlin Dever. It began airing on HBO on September 12, 2020. Other recordings In 2011, HarperCollins published i Shudder, a collection of Rudnick's autobiographical essays, some of which covered his work on stage and screen, interspersed with fictional works depicting Eliot Vionnet, a fictional 1998, Rudnick was a frequent contributor to the *New Yorker*, mostly over 50 short pieces of humor. His works appear in collections of fierce pajamas and anxiety, please. In 1988, Rudnick began producing a satirical critique film for *Premiere Magazine* called *Libby Gelman-Waxner*, a deranged Manhattan wife, mother and assistant buyer of Juniors Activewear. Libby's collection of columns was published in 1994 under the title *If You Ask Me*, and Janet Maslin wrote in *The New York Times* that Mr. Rudnick weaves a lot of trench thought into Libby's comic screeds. The premiere came to a head in 2007, but Libby resumed writing a monthly column for *Entertainment Weekly* in 2011 and occasionally contributors to *The New Yorker*. On May 1, 2013, Scholastic published *Magnificent, The First Novel for Young Adults*. Publishers Weekly, in a stellar review, said the book included a letter that is hilarious, secular and insightful (often within one sentence.) Scholastic also published his second young adult novel, *It's All Your Fault*, which a booklist called *Laughter Out Loud*, an irreverent story built on as much snarkiness as sweetness. It's a very good read. Rud writes a book for the Broadway musical adaptation of *The Devil Wears Prada*, which is scheduled to premiere in *The Summer of 2021* in Chicago ahead of the Broadway production. The musical's creative team also includes Elton John (composer), Shane Taub (lyricist) and Anna D. Shapiro (director). Starring Beth Leavel as Miranda Priestley (created by Meryl Streep on screen) and Taylor Iman Jones as Andy (created by Anne Hathaway on screen).
