The move comes as the company struggles to keep up with budget airlines. The airline is reportedly working with British supermarket chain Waitrose to sell sandwiches on short-haul flights to reduce airfares. In addition, charging for meals will allow the airline to make an additional profit. This seems to contrast with The Long-Standing Policy of British Airways, offering free meals on all trips. Customers on long-haul flights will continue to enjoy free three-course meals. On these flights, a British Airways spokesman said, food is an alternative to the normal free menu that stays on board. Customers can instead opt for pre-order and pre-payment through ba.com for one of six extended dishes, including gourmet meals, a great British breakfast and a taste of the east. However, removing free meals on short flights is not likely to prove popular. Most flights between cities take seven to eight hours, so a 5 hour, 16 minute flight is quite a record holder. The 250 mph jet stream increased the plane to near supersonic speeds. The airline has cancelled all flights from Heathrow and Gatwick, which depart until 18:00 GMT. The outage causes very serious disruption to our flights around the world, the company said in a statement, passengers completely avoid London airports. Please don't come to the airports. Angry travellers took to social media to post pictures of the chaos at Heathrow and plead with British Airways for more information which was rare. Both Lufthansa and Air France were hit by similar outages last month, Reuters reported. While this may not help stranded travelers jet off their planned vacations, passengers affected by unexpected delays and cancellations in the European Union are entitled to compensation. According to a 2004 European Commission decree, passengers are entitled to compensation for delays of more than two hours, depending on the distance of the flight.
